ENRICHMENT AND EXTENSION NEWS

Semester 2 has been an interesting time for us all and the students have completed some challenging and rewarding tasks. The students who attend the Enrichment and Extension program are encouraged to develop learning habits based on 'The Habits of Mind' by Arthur L. Costa and Bena Kallick. Developing these habits will contribute to their life long love of learning. We provide a program that extends the classroom learning and is designed to motivate and develop higher-order thinking skills and strategies that will enable them to meet life's challenges.

In the Language and Expression program we have focussed on the wide variety of picture books that authors and artists produce. The students also investigated picture books without words, studying 'Mirror' by Jeannie Baker in detail. We looked at how this book could inspire us to complete a wide variety of learning tasks. The students identified their preferred learning styles and years 3-6 wrote their own unit of work that incorporated learning styles and thinking skills.

The students enjoyed the team challenges. Working in a co-operative team is an important learning experience where students brainstorm, prioritise and are given the opportunity to perform before an audience. Team challenges are designed to enhance creativity, divergent thinking and teamwork. The challenges were presented to students in the 'Language and Expression' and 'Solution Finding' sessions. They encourage fluency, develop flexibility, emphasise originality and inspire elaboration in the students' thinking. At the end of each challenge, students write a reflection on their involvement in the process. Students gain confidence in taking risks in a supportive environment and develop important team-building skills.

We live in a highly visual world so the use of graphic organisers as a teaching tool is effective. A graphic organiser is a visual tool that is used to organise ideas and information. This semester the students found the 'Pyramid' graphic organiser, amongst others, a very useful aid in analysing as well as planning a story.

Our visitors this semester were well received. Mark Greenwood, a well-known Australian author, entertained the students with his performance on 'Breathing Life into Myths and legends'. He inspired their natural curiosity about books. Mark's presentation provided ideas and strategies to enhance their creative writing. The 'Speech Snatchers' performance was an informative teaching tool for developing speech writing and speech making skills. The K-2 students enjoyed the shadow puppet play, 'The Mermaid's Daughter' – a journey into the shadows and music of West Africa. This performance demonstrated the creative process in telling stories.

The 'Solution Finding' program develops skill in applying problem solving strategies to a variety of situations. Robotics has a focus in all stages. Robotics encourages students to think creatively, analyse situations and apply critical thinking and problem solving skills to real world problems. Robotics involves differentiating the curriculum at a high level and has proven to be a successful addition to the 'Solution Finding' program. The students have enjoyed developing their understanding and skills in technology, maths and science. The key facet of robotics promotes problem analysis, real world design and programming. This enables students to develop the design process and programming which involves logical thinking and consideration of options. All students in years 3 to 6 in Solution Finding during 2012 will be developing the skills in robotics that are essential for participation in the First Lego League (FLL) competition. A team of students will be formed for the competition at the end of semester 1.

SCAMPER is a creative teaching strategy for developing original and imaginative thinking.

SCAMPER is also a strategy that can assist in an individual student's evaluation of a finished design task. Students have followed the design process to complete set tasks and then evaluated their design by using the components of SCAMPER.

The Visual Arts' program endeavours to challenge all students' minds and arouse feelings. Understanding art involves learning how to become aware of the special nature of objects through our senses. It is through practice and trial and error that we learn to understand art. Each new art experience increases the students' ability to express their ideas and feelings. Students learn by looking at the art of others. This develops their powers of creative thinking.

This semester we have been inspired by **Joan Miro**, **Andy Warhol**, **Leonardo da Vinci** and **Ramon Bracamonte** our artist in residence. We have also been inspired by various artists who have been successful entrants in the 'Archibald Prize'. Studying and being inspired by these artists and their artworks has been our main focus. As we study the artworks we learn how to express our ideas in a variety of ways. We devote a great deal of time to developing knowledge and skills in the 'Visual Arts' program and as the students' skills develop their artworks reflect this acquired knowledge and understanding.

The students in years 5 and 6 have progressed to the stage where they have made choices for their major artwork using a variety of artists' media:

sculptures using clay and wire,

canvas artworks using acrylic and/or oil paint,

watercolour artworks on paper using pencil and/or 'Inktense' pencils

photographic representations of the elements of art and then using the 'Photoshop' program to create various, original visual effects.

In all sessions the students have learnt how to keep a journal as a record of their development in understanding the world of art. They use their journal as a place to experiment with a variety of media and then reflect on the success of their experiments. Students are taught how to reflect on their artworks and the artworks of others and in doing so, enhance their creativity.

We have enjoyed working with the students this year and we are looking forward to 2012.

As the Christmas and New Year holiday season approaches, thousands of families are set to hit the roads for a holiday adventure. A concern for everyone across the country is always that of road safety over this time. There are more people using our roads at this time meaning there is a higher risk for accident, injury or even death. Motorists are urged to be extra cautious especially at night and when passing through residential areas, due to the unpredictable actions of pedestrians.

Driving tips that will help make sure your journey is a safe one

- Don't set off on a long trip at the end of a day's work.
- Sleep well before travelling. Don't drive at times you would normally be asleep.
- Take a 15 minute break outside your car every two hours. There are almost 100 community driver reviver sites that operate throughout NSW during holiday periods.
- Eat well balanced meals at regular times. You need the energy for brain activity and concentration while driving.
- Do not use your mobile phone while driving. Turn off your mobile phone or keep it on silent.
- Pack some quiet activities for the children in the car such as portable DVD players, books, small computer games, portable music player with headphones.

- Click Clack Front 'n' Back when in the car.
- Use the footpath-side door when getting in and out of a car.
- Hold a grown-up's hand when on the footpath, in a car park or crossing the road.
- Stop! Look! Listen! Think! When crossing the road.
- Cross the road at a pedestrian crossing where possible.
- When getting off a bus, wait until the bus has gone before using a safe place to cross the road
- Always wear a helmet when riding a bike and don't ride on busy roads.


